#### Olamala

44,000/-

Made of 100% Sisal

Colour : Ola green and Beige


Size: 6ft X 9ft

Technique: Jacquard Thickness: 5 mm


Olamala, or palm garland, is traditionally made by folding and linking coconut leaves into long, decorative chains. Hung in courtyards and along thresholds, they are a symbol of welcome and festivity. This rug translates the garland's rhythmic, interlinked form into a continuous jacquard pattern. Woven in Ola Green and beige sisal, Olamala captures the grace of a familiar Kerala craft in a clean, contemporary weave.







JACQUARD A Jacquard weave is a complex fabric pattern created using a special loom that controls each warp thread individually, enabling intricate designs directly woven into the textile.



#### Pookkalam

Made of 100% Sisal

Colour: Ola green and Beige

Size:6ft X 9ft

Technique: Jacquard Thickness: 5 mm

Pookkalam is the intricate floral arrangement made on the ground during Onam—petals placed in careful patterns, colours coming together in intricate floral geometry. This design reimagines the symmetry and rhythm of the pookkalam in Ola Green and beige, jacquard woven into sisal. The floral form is held within a checkerboard layout, giving a modern structure to a tradition shaped by patience, community, and the joy of creating with what nature offers.







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### Pambaram


Made of 100% Sisal

Colour : Ola green and Beige

Technique: Jacquard Thickness: 5 mm

Pambaram is a spinning top made from coconut leaves—one of the many ola kalippattams we grew up learning to fold and play with. A clever little craft, now mostly forgotten, passed down through hands. Jacquard woven in Ola Green and beige, the rug captures the layered geometry of the toy in bold, rhythmic forms. A tribute to movement, memory, and the joy of making something out of whats already around us.







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## Pattam pole


Made of 100% Sisal

Colour : Ola green and Beige

Size:6ft X 9ft

Technique: Jacquard Thickness: 5 mm

Named after toy kites made from ola, strips of coconut leaf folded and shaped with care —'Pattampole' draws from a craft rooted in play and simplicity. Jacquard woven in sisal, with Ola Green motifs on a beige base, the rug carries the same sense of balance and movement. The repeating forms echo the geometry of folded leaves, each shape a quiet memory of time spent making and playing in Kerala.









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## Nalangam



Nalangam — Drawn from the Malayalam word നാലംഗം, meaning "four parts," this rug celebrates four traditional ola kalippattams (palm-leaf toys). Fish, ola pambaram (spinning top), olapookklam (floral pattern), and others appear here as woven motifs — playful echoes of a craft once made by hand for children. Each form retains its individuality, yet together they compose a whole, much like the fragments of memory and tradition they embody







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#### Kaattadi





Technique: Jacquard

Thickness:5 mm

Kaattaadi is a pinwheel made from coconut leaves, fixed to a stick so it spins with the wind or the motion of a run. Once a familiar sight in the hands of children, it's a simple craft that turns everyday materials into play. This rug reimagines the pinwheel's intersecting blades in a pattern of stripes and solids, arranged around a clear centre. Jacquard woven in Ola Green and beige sisal, Kaattaadi carries forward a piece of Kerala's playful craft tradition into a textured, modern form.







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## Tharangam

Made of 100% Sisal



Technique: Jacquard

Thickness:5 mm

In Malayalam, Tharangam means wave or rhythm. Its form is inspired by festive fish motifs woven from tender coconut (ola) leaves — a familiar sight during Kerala's celebrations. Repeating diagonally across the rug, these forms create a sense of movement, like ripples in water or the gentle sway of festival décor. In Ola Green and beige sisal, Tharangam carries the spirit of tradition in a flowing, contemporary rhythm.







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
